All application materials, including this form, should be submitted via email to Honorsprogram@riag.ri.gov. Applications will be accepted starting August 20, 2023 and applications are due by October 20, 2023, at which point finalists will be invited to interview before final selections are made. Applicants may direct questions about applying to Honorsprogram@riag.ri.gov.

The 2024 Attorney Honors Program begins September 2024. All selected Honors Program attorneys must commit to a one-year term and must take the Rhode Island bar exam no later than July 2024.

Eligibility

The Attorney General's Office seeks applications for its Honors Program from:

- Third-year law students scheduled to graduate in 2024 (or fourth-year evening law students scheduled to graduate in 2024);
- Newly admitted lawyers in their first year of practice;
- Judicial clerks who will complete their clerkships by September 2024; and
- Individuals participating in government, academic, or public interest fellowships who will complete their fellowships by September 2024.

In addition to this (1) form, you must submit a (2) cover letter, (3) resume, (4) unofficial copy of your law school transcript, and (5) a writing sample.
