Dear Members of the Hiring Committee,

I am writing to express my interest in the position of Inspector General. As a Rhode Island native of Cape Verdean descent, attorney, and retired Army Sergeant First Class with more than twenty-two years of military service, I bring extensive investigative, compliance, and oversight experience aligned directly with the responsibilities detailed in RIGL 42-9.4.

In my role at the Public Defender's Office, I have managed more than 600 cases and litigated multiple trials, requiring impartial fact-finding, detailed analysis, and rigorous adherence to ethical and procedural standards. This experience translates directly to investigating fraud, waste, abuse, and mismanagement; evaluating agency policies; and resolving complaints under state law.

My Army career—including six combat deployments—provided significant experience in regulatory enforcement, risk mitigation, and organizational oversight. As Senior Ammunition Manager for the 1st Special Forces Command (Airborne), I supervised compliance for more than \$450 million in ammunition and explosives, conducted inspections, enforced DoD and Army regulations, and trained more than 240 personnel in accountability and safety procedures. As an Army Jumpmaster, I enforced airborne safety regulations, performed detailed inspections, and certified compliance during high-risk missions. These roles required impartial judgment, strict adherence to standards, and the ability to identify deficiencies and implement corrective action—competencies essential to the Inspector General's mission.

Additionally, I have led major policy and governance initiatives, including updating organizational regulatory guidance for the first time in seven years and strengthening oversight across multiple units. My work regularly involved collaboration with federal and military agencies, reflecting the interagency coordination responsibilities in RIGL 42-9.4.

With more than a decade of combined legal, investigative, compliance, and oversight experience, I am prepared to:

- conduct investigations involving fraud, waste, abuse, and mismanagement;
- evaluate agency policies and develop corrective action plans;
- protect whistleblowers and investigate retaliation;
- prepare formal reports and recommendations; and
- coordinate with the Attorney General, law enforcement, and the Auditor General to enhance efficiency and accountability.

I welcome the opportunity to further discuss how my background, experience, and commitment to public service align with the mission and expectations of the Office of the Inspector General.
