As reflected within my attached resume, I have been in positions of significant authority and responsibility. I have served as Executive Director of the New Jersey State Parole Board, an agency of 645 sworn and civilian staff overseeing 16,500 parolees and a budget of \$121 million and Director of Parole with the Colorado Department of Corrections responsible for the supervision of 365 sworn and civilian staff members. I currently serve as the Deputy Director of Adult Services with the Los Angeles Probation Department, responsible for the supervision of all facets of adult probation with the largest probation department in the United States. I have overseen ten federal grants and was responsible for numerous multi-million dollar contracts. I have worked extensively with both juvenile and adult populations and take a great deal of pride in developing housing resources for justice-involved populations, ensuring there were no homeless individuals under parole supervision.

Throughout my career, I have significant experience working with the administrative office of the courts and the juvenile population in the positions to which I was assigned at the New Jersey State Parole Board as well as in collaboration with the Juvenile Justice Commission to ensure the unique needs of juveniles who encountered the criminal justice system are given full consideration. I have also worked closely with members of local, county, state, and federal law enforcement officials as well as the Judiciary with respect to individuals under probation supervision. I collaborated with the Chief Justice of the New Jersey Administrative Office of the Courts to provide programming and services for the benefit of the 63,000 probationers under supervision. We demonstrated that the provision of wraparound evidence-based services upon release produced safer communities, reduced incarceration within all settings, and saved federal, state and local communities billions of dollars in costs of incarceration.
